

January always makes me think that the boating season is just around the corner. On days like today, the weather here is in the 70's and the sky is blue, so how can you think otherwise.

In preparation for the season to begin, be sure to get the following up and ready to be on the water.

1. If you have an outboard motor, review the lines for cracking and wear. Lines include both fuel and electrical, don't wait until the busy Spring season to get that annual tune -up as mechanics will have less availability.

2. Inboards are a little easier in the off-season. Change the oil, spark plugs and other basic tune-up items. Be sure to check your stern drive housing for any obstructions like plant life or solid structures that may have gotten stuck during the winter months.

3. Now is a good time to check your canvas, halyards, mooring lines, fenders and the possible loose items on the boat. Clear scuppers and be sure you are ready for the potential storms coming.

4. One of the best things you can do to add to your engine especially if you don't run it that often is to add fuel stabilizer. This will help to lessen gum accumulation and water build up. Gum build up can clog jets and injectors. Water in your fuel from condensation without a stabilizer will corrode and cause damages well beyond the minimal efforts of adding the stabilizer.

Hope this information gets you moving to a great year ahead.

## Updates: News, Alerts and Reminders

\* <u>We do require masks</u> at the marina while on the main deck, office area, and restrooms. If on a dock please wear your mask if others are present. Lets keep safe!

\* <u>We are ready to secure</u> your garden spot for the 2021 growing season. Please contact Devery to be added to the list for a spot. Space is limited, so please let us know.

\* <u>Chickens are laying again</u>, although a little slowly, but we have new chicks coming so they should be adding to production by mid summer season. Eggs are available in the office with limited supply (no big omelettes yet).
\* <u>Gate codes will be changed March 1st</u> for those that keep their boats at the marina all year. Please be compliant in the policy to keep your code to yourself and in keeping Owl Harbor safe for you and your boat. We are happy to provide a guest code to vendors, visitors and guests. You will be emailed a code at the same time your March statement is sent out on February 12<sup>th</sup>. Please make note of this code effective March 1.
\* The fitness room we have is starting to get a real work out - which is a good thing. Please do not add items of personal use without approval from the marina. All items, equipment, and additional product that has not been approved will be removed by February 1. Please take all personal items back to your home for storage.

Please review your garbage and recycling practices. Each dock has a tote for each type of waste and we need you to do your part in making sure the carts are available for everyone on your dock. No waste should be emptied without a securely closed/sealed bag; garbage and recycle. ALL boxes need to be broken down and placed in recycle cart; not used for trash and placed in garbage cart. This is a community, we require everyone to follow the protocol in this matter for the OHM crew as well as the law according to Waste Management and Cal Waste. If you don't understand the rule, please ask, we are here to help.
